Our Evensong sermons during Lent Term reflect on the theme of 'encountering God'. By exploring a range of stories from the Bible, our visiting speakers consider how divine encounters reveal surprising truths about God's identity, and ours.

Olga Fabrikant-Burke was born and bred in Moscow, before completing her doctorate in the Old Testament at Cambridge, and serving as Chaplain of Trinity College. She now lectures in the Old Testament at Ridley Hall in Cambridge. Simeon Zahl is Professor of Christian Theology in the Faculty of Divinity. His recent research has focussed on the doctrine of the Holy Spirit, the place of experience and emotion in the Christian life, and the theological legacy of the Protestant Reformation. Andrew Goddard has lectured in theological ethics at the Universities of Oxford, Durham, and Bristol, and is an Honorary Canon of Winchester Cathedral. Since 2013, he has ministered at St James the Less, Pimlico. Jack Day hails from Australia, and is currently completing his doctorate in the Old Testament at the Faculty of Divinity. Alex Macdonald is the current Decani Scholar at Clare, and is a doctoral student in patristics in the Faculty of Divinity. Peter Judd was the Chaplain of Clare from 1976 to 1981, and later served as the Provost, and then Dean, of Chelmsford Cathedral. He is a Bye-Fellow of Clare.

COVER IMAGE

The cover image is *Simeon with the Infant Christ Child at the Temple* (1669), the last surviving painting of Rembrandt (1606–69). The aged Simeon had been promised by God that he would not die until he had seen the Messiah. When Jesus was brought into the Temple in Jerusalem, Simeon recognised his Saviour, and said that he could now 'depart in peace'. This encounter is the subject of Dr Fabrikant-Burke's sermon on 2 February.
